# Divine Adoption Plan

His Son redeems us

The Spirit of his Son seals the sonship

# (1) Redeemed by the Son

Gal 4:4-5

But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship.

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- born under the law
- that we might receive adoption to sonship
- to redeem those under the law



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- Redeem = to buy sth back to secure its liberation
- NLT version: God sent his Son to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law



The Wonderful Exchange:

The Son of God became a son of man so  
that we children of humanity might  
become children of God

## A Trinitarian Effort!

- Father : Sends his Son + Spirit (vv4, 6)
- Son : Redeems us (vv4-5)
- Spirit : Witnesses to us (v6)

## (2) Gifted with Spirit of the Son

Gal 4:6-7

And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, “Abba! Father!” So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God.

What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us (1 Cor 2:12)

And hope does not put us to shame,  
because God's love has been poured out  
into our hearts through the Holy Spirit  
who has been given to us (Rom 5:5)

# Our Inheritance

Lord, you alone are my portion and my cup; you make my lot secure. The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; surely I have a delightful inheritance (Ps 16:5-6)

All those that are justified, God vouchsafes, in and for His only Son Jesus Christ, to make partakers of the grace of adoption: by which they are taken into the number, and enjoy the liberties and privileges of the children of God; have His name put upon them, receive the Spirit of adoption; have access to the throne of grace with boldness; are enabled to cry, Abba, Father; are pitied, protected, provided for, and chastened by Him as by a Father; yet never cast off, but sealed to the day of redemption, and inherit the promises, as heirs of everlasting salvation.
